Student-Directed Topics



Ask:


- Think of your day. Who do you talk with, and about what?
- Think of your future goals (career, community involvement, etc.). Who do you want to be able to talk with?
- Have students draw pictures

Teach Vocabulary



Vocabulary to understand others as well as to express themselves

- Bilingual dictionary
- Longman Dictionary of
 Contemporary English
 Online



Teach Vocabulary

- Listening/pronunciation:
 - Reductions/connected speech/linking
 - one video lesson
- Review/quiz for value/retention -
 - **Quizlet**

Vary Student Groupings



- Whole group, small group, pairs
- Dialogs/role play a scenario
 - a. Proliteracy: Dialogs into Role Play Part 1 & Part 2
- Casual conversation keep it going
- Fishbowl students give suggestions for variations

Teach Conversation Strategies



- Introducing a topic, drawing each other out, asking for opinions, interrupting, agreeing, disagreeing, etc.
- eslgold.com/speaking/phrases

Focus on Communication or Correctness?

- Depends on goal of conversation and student goal.
- Delineate time in class for each
- Pronunciation Pairs manythings.org/pp
- Rotating pairs for repeated practice

Give Feedback



- Degree of participation and understanding of conversation
- Use of new vocabulary, strategies
- Specific areas a given student needs to develop
- Assess informally, or using a checklist
 - a. Google form
 - b. Recordings saved as portfolio
